# **Projects**

**#2579**: MassEcon is working with a Georgia-based site location consultant representing a New York headquarted seafood processing company that is seeking existing buildings previously used for food processing or a 15+ acre land site to build a facility. The site should be zoned light or heavy industrial, have a 2,500 ft. buffer from residential areas. This company will employ 50-100 people. The search area is within 75 miles of the coast. *Note: Western MA is also an option because of proximity to New York City.* 

**#2584**: MassEcon is working with an in-state food products company who would like to buy or lease 100,000-175,000 SF (20,000 SF used for office) or land to build-to-suit. Sewer is required, 22' min. ceiling height, heavy power, and adequate parking. The company currently employs approximately 100 people. The ideal location is within walking distance/close proximity to a MBTA commuter rail station along the Boston/Providence line. *Note: Roughly 20% of the people employed at this company commute from the Providence area.* 

**#2586**: MassEcon, MOBD, and MassDevelopment are working with a RI based manufacturer in the surface finishing business and they would like to lease 45,000-55,000 SF with 18' clear, 3-5 loading docks, and single story. The company currently employs about 90 people. MA communities within a 20 minute radius of Cumberland, RI (i.e. Attleboro, Plainville, Seekonk, Franklin, Bellingham, Wrentham, to name a few). *Note: New England is the major market destination for this company's services.*
