Project Azalea: MassEcon coordinated partners from MassBio, MLSC, and MOBD, who recently met with a Washington D.C. site location consultant representing a major biopharmaceutical company considering a 140,000 SF expansion in Massachusetts. This project represents a \$215 million investment and 320 new jobs. Major biotech hubs in the eastern U.S. are being considered. Thank you to MassEcon members Ernst & Young for assisting the team with a request for information, and Nutter McClennen & Fish LLP for hosting the meeting at its office in the Seaport District. Update: The consultant has selected three buildings in New Bedford, Bedford, and Norwood to consider. MLSC has provided an incentives proposal to the consultant for review.

Project Wildfox: MassEcon was contacted by an Indianapolis-based site location consultant representing a Rhode Island food and beverage company. The company is considering 50,000 - 100,000 SF buildings and 10-acre industrial parcels within a 45-mile radius of Woonsocket, Rhode Island. Connecticut and Rhode Island are also being considered.

Update: The site location consultant will be visiting Massachusetts in early

December to tour selected sites and communities.

MassEcon was contacted by a Dallas-based real estate firm representing a wireless company client that is interested in evaluating locations in the Northeast for an inbound customer service contact center. They will need 50,000-70,000 SF of office space for 500-600 employees. Springfield, New Bedford/Fall River, and Worcester/Fitchburg/Leominster are markets they have identified to research.
