Brand and market the Southeastern Marine Science and Technology Corridor

2,000 acres of quality development and redevelopment sites

75% of SRPEDD municipalities will have in place some form of **expedited permitting process** for economic development projects

Among its goals – To BROADEN REGION'S ECONOMIC PROFILE AND PROMOTE EMPLOYMEMT OPPORTUNITIES IN EMERGING SECTORS SUCH AS MARINE SCIENCE AND BIOTECH

- biomedical and biotechnical (Life Sciences); advanced materials; manufacturing supercluster; agribusiness, food processing and technology; apparel and textiles; and, forest and wood products

- Several manufacturing supercluster sectors are identified within the region including electrical equipment, appliance and component manufacturing; fabricated metal product manufacturing; machine manufacturing; and, primary metal

- emerging industry sectors are defense and security; information technology and telecommunication; transportation and logistics; energy-renewables, and business and services.


Cape Cod Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy 2019-2023

- Welcome emerging industries that would complement the Cape's economy




Bristol County: Sample Employers by 2019 Job Listings


Cape Cod: Sample Employers by 2019 Job Listings


South Shore: Sample Employers by 2019 Job Listings







High Concentration of Life Sciences in the Southeast




